Preschool and School Age Care Update

Lois Klein introduced Alice Murphy, Director of School Age Care and Preschool. Ms. Murphy reported on the District's school age care services before and after school, which is offered at all elementary school sites and at the two middle school sites. Ms. Murphy reported that Allen Avenue Preschool is beginning its third full year of operation. The second District Preschool, housed at Grace Miller Elementary School, opened on September 29, 2008.

Lois Klein noted that beginning in 2004 the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Centers for Disease Control, the California Department of Health Services, and the California School Nurses Organization updated their recommendations regarding the exclusion of children from school due to head lice. Based on an analysis of scientific and medical evidence, it is now the position of these groups that children with nits (not active, adult lice) are not contagious. Therefore, in order to minimize the disruption of the educational process, the groups now recommend that students with nits be allowed to remain in school and that students with active, adult lice be referred to their parents for treatment.
