1.Tell us a little about your program?

Meet J.T. McLuckey, Education Specialist at Bonita Highschool



1.Tell us a little about your program?

"I am the SAI Science teacher at Bonita High School. In our classes we incorporate the NGSS standards into our curriculum as best as we can. However, I gear my classes to focus on three main components: Writing, Critical Thinking, and Collaboration. After the first few years of teaching, I realized that a majority of my students struggle with these three skills. Science is important but learning skills that can be used not only in other classes but in life outside of school is so much more important than memorizing a few vocab words."

2.What is your favorite aspect of teaching?

"The connections you make with students. I always enjoyed making connections with people but I never realized how much connecting with a student can impact me."

3.What are you looking forward to this year?

"I am looking forward to having those natural conversations in class that we did not have last year over zoom."

4.What is something that has happened this year that you are proud of? "This past year I had my first graduated student come to say hi. He began to tell us how our class helped him out in his current job and how my aide and I made an impact on him. I was overcome with joy to hear that I actually helped out this former student because I thought he was not the biggest fan of my aide and myself. It made me realize that this is exactly why we do what we do as teachers! "
